

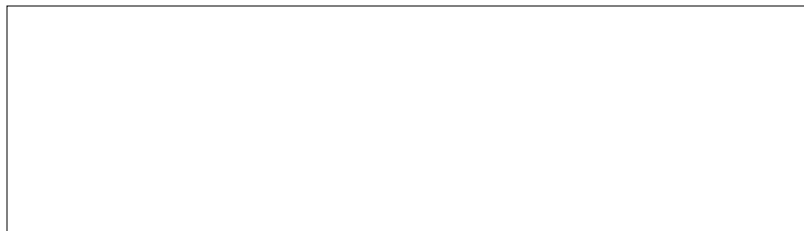

Thanks to Richard and Nancy Chinn for delivering them!

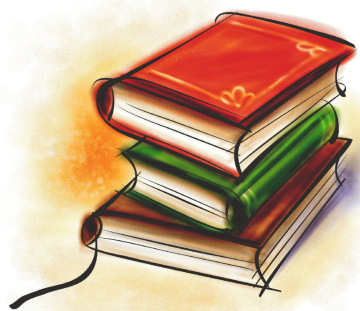
If any of you would like to donate a Bible to Open Door, please bring it to the library and lay it on the desk. I will give the donated Bibles to the Chinn's to deliver.

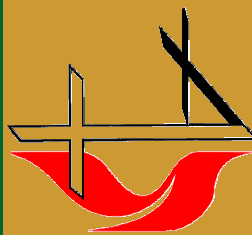

Please feel free to express your thoughts about anything to do

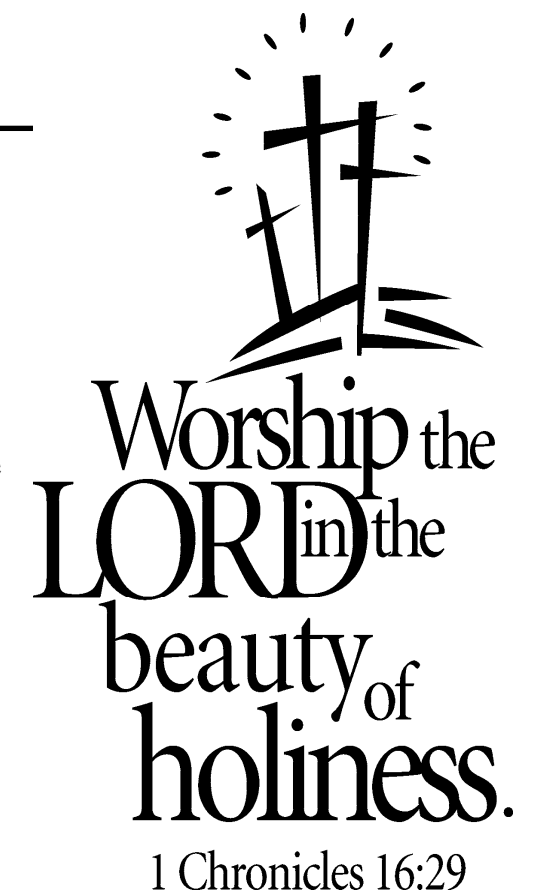
with worship. Worship isn't a spectator occasion, it's all participation!

L. E. Junior McCabe was born on January 2, which makes it easy to remember. 1-2-18.

Jr. went to school at Lincoln Elementary in Wichita, which is still there today. Jr. met his wife, Elizabeth (Betty) at Sandy Beach. Betty worked at the roller rink. They dated for a year before getting married on 12-40. They had four children: Lauren Bruse, Catherine Lucille, Charles William, and Deborah Elizabeth.

He worked doing cement finishing for the new airports during the war. They went to work on Monday mornings at 8:00 am and came home at 6:00 pm Friday evenings, which meant they slept and ate beside the runways. Junior remembers sleeping in a wheel barrel, as others slept by them. He also did a lot of firefighting work; he was one of the original members of the Sedgwick County Fire Department when it became a paid department on 1-1-55. He started as a Lieutenant and made his way through the ranks and retired 31 years later as a Deputy Fire Chief.

At vacation time, they would travel through several states. Betty and Jr. made it through 49 states and Mexico, only missing Maine by about 15 miles.

As for Haysville UMC, he remembers horsing around with Rev. Jim Landsdowne in the watermelon patch. To the youth of the church he says, "Always trust in God."

Next, we have Joseph Brantley. Joe was born on 6-5-21 in Wilson, NC, and was raised on a tobacco and cotton farm.

Joe was in the Navy from 1942—1945. While in the Navy he was stationed in Hutchinson, KS and met his first wife Maxine. She was working at Boeing in Wichita. They were married on 12-22-45, and had 2 kids, Randy and Joanne.

Joe's first son, Randy, was in the Navy. While in DiDang, he loaded gas and Asian Orange on the planes. Before Randy's death, as a result of the Asian Orange, Randy, Joe and 13 others went for a 5 day fishing trip to Grassy Lodge in Canada. After two days of eating fish, Joe and Randy started taking PB&J sandwiches. He and his family did lots of camping.

Joe was in Williamsburg, VA in 1932 and saw the restoration of Williamsburg by Rockefeller. Williamsburg is the home of Williams and Mary, the 2nd oldest college in America.

After the Navy, Joe worked for Swallow Aircraft, dressing down screwdriver blades. He then worked at Butts Buick, Cadillac and Oldsmobile from 1966—1983. God was strongest in Joe's life when his 1st Maxine was in the hospital with cancer. She never left the hospital. Maxine passed on in November of 1990.

As a youth in North Carolina, there was a lake by the watermill from his farm, where grain was taken to be ground. Joe couldn't swim. One time a black man across the way stopped working a field and waded in, and saved him from drowning. Another time he was bitten by a snake in the same lake!

Joe started attending at Haysville UMC at the little white church. He attended off and on for 57 years. Joe and his 2nd wife, Maxine, have been married for 20 years. He watched her during church services right here. Finally, he got up his nerve to ask her out to lunch after church. Her aunt went with them, as Maxine always took her to Sunday lunch, and the rest is history. Between the two Maxine's, he has 4 kids and many grandchildren and great grandchildren.

The wisdom he would give to those that go to Haysville UMC is to "Keep believing in God."

We say thanks for all you have done for your community, country and church! When you see JR and Joe, give them a special handshake and a heartfelt thank you!

two amplifiers for guitar and bass guitar, to Debi McClure, and Jeremy King for helping me with musical advise & technology issues. I could not do this with out your help.

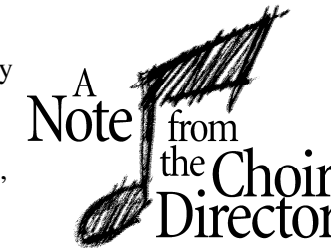
I greatly appreciate all of the prayers and private financial gifts that have come in.

Disaster Response

In the aftermath of the disasters that have happened in the past years, more and more people are asking how they can help.

One of the ways that the churches of the Kansas West Conference are helping is by sending in Basic Disaster Response Teams of volunteers who provide assistance and support to those affected by a disaster. Responders do not perform rebuilding or repair work that may jeopardize a victim's eligibility for financial assistance from insurance and government agencies. Responders **must** be trained and have received an ID card for access to the disaster to be sent out by the Conference and District Disaster Response Coordinators.



On August 14, 2011 at 2:30 PM, you will have the opportunity to get this training. We will be having a Disaster Response Training class, here at our church, led by Rev. Keith Fink, who is the Kansas West Conference Response Committee Chairperson.
