A Note From the Music Desk...



"The Glory of These Forty Days"

Origins We don't know who wrote this hymn, but we know that it is very old -- at least as early as the tenth century, and probably much older. When this hymn was first sung, few people could read. They learned these words and sang them from memory -or heard a choir sing them. As long ago as the Dark Ages, this hymn was bringing light into the lives of Christians.

The hymn speaks of "forty days." The forty days of which it speaks were the forty days of Christ's temptation. Those were days of hunger and thirst, because Jesus fasted for those forty days. They were days spent in the loneliness of the desert. We wouldn't want to experience what Jesus experienced during those forty days, because they were hard days, but this hymn speaks of "the glory of these forty days," and it says, "we celebrate with songs of praise."



Those words might seem odd, given Jesus' suffering during those forty days -but it isn't his suffering that we celebrate -- it is his triumph over evil -- and his promise to help us triumph over evil as well. As we remember Jesus' temptation, let us not forget that we are tempted too -- often -every day. Let us remember to pray for Christ's help each day -- that Christ will keep us on the right path -that God will help us to accomplish something worthy -- and that Christ will protect us from the evil one.

This is a wonderful hymn over a millennia old that is still used during Lent by modern Christians. If you are not familiar with the song or would like to hear it, please go to either Spotify.com or Youtube.com so you can experience it. May you take this Lenten season of 2013 and renew your spirit as we journey towards Jesus and His ultimate resurrection!

One Call Phone Notification System

This system has now been in place for one year and is working beautifully!

For those who are unfamiliar with the system, you submit a phone number to the office. Any time there is a meeting, cancelation, important announcement, etc. you will receive an automated message from the church to that number letting you know of important information.

Please note that due to pricing constraints, we are limited to one phone number per household.

The phone number you submit will be what every message is sent to.

When you receive a message from OneCall, the caller ID will show HUMC 316-524-4162. Please listen carefully to the recorded message. Some people have mentioned that their phones and/or voicemail bring the message up midway through. If this happens, stay on the line until the end of the message. At this time, the entire message will repeat itself.

Please take a moment and decide on which phone number you want to use for your household. Submit this number (and name) to the church office by calling 524-4162 or emailing at: office@haysvilleumc.org.

If you prefer to opt out of this system, let the church office know as soon as possible. Remember, this will affect your entire household if you opt out.

The church is also trying to implement an email-based notification system to inform you of events, etc. A prime example is the Spiritual Gifts hybrid class, which relied heavily on email-based communication. Please submit your current email address to the church office. If you would prefer not to receive notification from us via email, please let the office know you want to opt out.
