

## The Words on the **Coffee Filter**

If you were in church a few weeks ago, you discovered a coffee filter--tucked in your hymnal next to words that read,

"O for a heart to praise my God, a heart from sin set free, A heart that always feels they blood so freely shed for me. A heart in every thought renewed and full of love divine, perfect and right and pure and good, a copy, Lord, of thine."

And you were asked, "What needs to be filtered out of your life so that you can have your cup filled with all that is of God?

Lent has always, rightly, been a time when we seek to add God-centered disciplines to our lives: Adding times of denial to remember how Christ denied Himself for us, adding spiritual



disciplines that had faded from our regular practice-such as prayer, fasting, scripture reading.

But as we began our Lenten

Journey to a Life Beyond the Tomb, individually, we each were—and are—given an opportunity to let some things go—permanently, to use each of these 40 days as a time to make a new, life-giving habit where once there was an old destructive one—a chance to filter out the old in order to be filled with the Newness of God. I am praying for each of you, that you act each day on that filter and that God gives you the strength and the commitment to become new in Him in that one, personal way.

## A Note From the Music Desk...



"O Sacred Head, Now

Hymn Wounded"

Paul Gerhardt was a great 17th century German hymn writer, although I must confess that this is the only one of his hymns that I recognized among the several that I found in American hymnals. Gerhardt translated the words of this hymn into German from a Latin text that he thought to have been written by Bernard of Clairvaux.

The original words were in seven stanzas honoring Jesus' feet, knees, hands, sides, breast, heart, and head. A British poet, Robert Bridges, and an American clergyman, James Alexander, translated the words from German into English.

The words have been modified considerably over the years, and vary from one hymnal to another. However, all include the first verse, which begins, "O sacred Head, now wounded, with grief and shame weighed down." The hymn honors Christ for his suffering on the cross, and asks how we can love and thank him enough.

The answer, of course, is that we can never love or thank him enough — but the Good News is that we are required to bring only our faith and devotion to Christ — not our perfection. It is his work, not ours, that saves us.

As you may be aware, last year it was decided by the Haysville Ministerial Alliance that all participating churches would refer people seeking food to the West Haysville Baptist Church (they have a much larger Pantry.) Our Pantry was, for a short time, filled to overflowing. Now it is nearly empty and waiting to

receive your donated food. We will continue collecting food throughout the year. Any persons needing food will be referred to West Haysville Baptist Church.

We had planned to deliver the existing food in our Pantry to West Haysville Baptist, but another urgent need was raised at the January Mission meeting. We learned that the Senior Center, which regularly distributes food to needy seniors, has been out of food for 2-3 months. We decided at this meeting to deliver our existing supply to the Senior Center as soon as arrangements can be made. Future deliveries of food will continue to help supply the Community Pantry at West Haysville Baptist or to the Senior Center, as need dictates, unless Missions determines there is another urgent need.
