A Note From the Music Desk...



"In Christ There Is No

Hymn *East or West*" Origins

In 1889, Rudyard Kipling published his poem, "The Ballad of East and West," which begins, "Oh, East is East, and West is West, and never the twain shall meet."

Those lines sound as if Kipling is saying that there is no hope that people from East and West can ever come together, but the opposite is true. The poem tells of Kamal, a man of India who steals an English Colonel's horse. The Colonel's son rides off in pursuit. The two men end up in a place where Kamal has a soldier behind every rock, but he respects the young Englishman's courage and spares his life. The young Englishman, in turn, passes up a chance to use a hidden pistol with which he could have killed Kamal. The poem ends as it began with these lines:

Oh, East is East, and West is West,

and never the twain shall meet,

Till Earth and Sky stand presently

at God's great Judgment Seat; But there is neither East nor West,

Border, nor Breed, nor Birth,

When two strong men stand face to face, though they come

from the ends of the earth!

Kipling's poem celebrates the possibility of mutual respect between people who are very different from each other.

Nine years later after Kipling's poem was published, <u>William Arthur</u> Dunkerly (using the pen name John Oxenham) wrote this hymn, "In Christ There Is No East or West." The occasion was a great missionary exhibition sponsored by the London Missionary Society.

The <u>hymn</u>, which gets its inspiration from Kipling's poem, takes Kipling's idea a step farther. It reminds us that Christ brings all sorts of people together "in one great fellowship of love." – Copyright 2007, Richard Niell Donovan

Pledges: With June 30 being the mid-point of the HUMC's fiscal year, we would like to remind everyone to review their pledge status to see if you are current. Credit Card Use for Ministry Team Purchases: It is very important that we be able to properly document and record expenses made through credit card purchases in the office. Therefore, effective immediately Finance is requiring that before any requests for purchases to be made using the HUMC credit card you must submit a completed check request/expense voucher form signed by the Ministry Team chair.

Fundraisers: The Finance Ministry Team would like to remind all groups (Ministry teams, Sunday Schools classes and organizations) that the Administrative Council has designated a 10% tithe is to be made to the Church on monies raised at any fundraising event held at the church. The monies will go to the Missions and Ministries of the church in recognition of your good stewardship to the Haysville United Methodist Church.

Servants By Design: Process Communication Model for Communities of Faith

"God has designed each and every person with a unique set of gifts and talents. If you are able to truly realize that design...you will experience a freedom like never before..." Dr. Robert Maris

Oh yes, you shaped me first inside, then out; you formed me in my mother's womb. I thank you, High God—you're breathtaking! Body and soul, I am marvelously made! I worship in adoration—what a creation!

You know me inside and out, you know every bone in my body...from Psalm 139 (The Message) You were created with care and purpose by an intentional, loving Creator and endowed with a unique design. This design influences how you perceive the world and the specific gifts you have to offer. Your particular strengths and perspective also point to certain pitfalls, ways in which you are likely to try to live life separately from God. We spend a great deal of precious energy running after a vague image of who we should be and often end up feeling unfulfilled, frustrated, and unknown.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if there were a tool available that would:

 give us insight into our God -given design—and those we love as well?

- help us understand, communicate with, encourage and appreciate each other more effectively?
- help us resolve misunderstandings more easily?
- help us discover our best 'fit' for different ministry and work areas?
- helps us work with each other—and reach out to others—in the most effective and supportive ways possible?
- be a tool for couples, parents, families, friends, and Sunday School classes-- to help them be more aware of each other's distress signals AND help them out of it?

There is! And it's coming to the Haysville United Methodist Church! Developed by Drs. Robert Maris and Jerry Richardson, Servants by Design is a personality and communications profile based on Dr. Taibi Kahler's Process Communications Model[™]. Servants by Design[™], Marriage by Design[™], and Parenting by Design[™] are the most helpful tools I've discovered for interpersonal relationships, self-awareness, and living the kingdom into being as Christ's Body, the Church.

Beginning mid- June, this class will be offered during our Sunday School hour by Pastor Phyllis. Individuals and whole classes are invited to be a part of an amazing approach to being the people of God!
