LifeTree Café Starts May 7 & YOU Are Invited!

This "conversation café"—located right here at the Haysville United Methodist Church in the area right off the Kitchen in the Fellowship Hall, is part of a national network of locations that offer participatory events related to life and faith.

The Lifetree Café experience is a weekly hour of "stories and conversations to feed the soul." The hour typically includes a short original film and guided conversation. Our hosts direct the hour. "It's sort of like a live, local talk show with an inspirational twist."

Topics, which change weekly, focus on popular life issues. Topics may include such things as loneliness, immigration, health, angels, guilt, prayer, and life after death. The documentary-style films feature everyday people with unusual stories, as well as nationally known figures. The organization's website, LifetreeCafe.com, invites visitors to participate online in the same topical conversations that occur each week at the live venues.

"Lifetree serves as a comfortable place to meet other people who are interested in the same issues." Schultz said. The experience gives people practical help and insight on life issues, and provides a hopeful spiritual connection.

People today want to participate in the conversation. It's not enough to simply hear someone lecture on an important topic. People want to share their thoughts, ask questions, and tell their own stories. Lifetree offers a safe place and time to do that."

Lifetree Café will be offered at 6:30 PM every Wednesday, starting on May 7. Admission, to the 60-minute events is free and refreshments are provided. A Nursery will be available for childcare, and kids' activities will also be available during this time. Questions or need more information?
